RECIPE By Mary Norwak Apple Pudding Cake

One of my favourite ways with apples is to make a pudding-cake. In case you are wondering, that is a pudding which is delicious with cream or custard when freshly-made, but then turns up happily again at teatime as a simple cake which is moist and full of flavour. You can use a mixture of cooking and eating apples, and the recipe takes about five minutes to assemble. I actually like to make two or three at a time, as it freezes beautifully and is a good way of getting rid of surplus fruit. The almond essence is essential and the almond/apple scent is wonderful as you take the tin from the oven. Do use butter too for perfect flavour and texture. It is best to wrap leftovers in foil and keep in the fridge to retain the fresh flavour.

1 lb (500g) apples 6 oz (150g) self-raising flour 1 teaspoon baking powder 6 oz (150g) caster sugar 2 eggs ½ teaspoon almond essence 4 oz (100g) butter (melted)

Grease an 8 ins (20cm) loose-bottomed round tin. Peel the apples and slice them roughly. Stir together the flour, baking powder and sugar until evenly mixed. Beat in the eggs, essence and melted butter. Don't overwork the mixture which will be rather like very soft marzipan to look at. Put half the mixture on the bottom of the tin. Cover with the apple slices and top with remaining mixture. Don't spread it evenly, but just blob it all over the apples. Bake at 350F/180C/Gs 4 for 1 ¼ hours. Leave in the tin for 15 minutes. Lift carefully on to a serving plate and sprinkle with a little caster sugar. Serve warm with cream, custard or Greek yoghurt, or cold as a cake.

The posts were in need of replacement which was undertaken by Blakeney Sailing Club. Thompson, as well as Blakeney Parish Council Community Fund, The Blakeney Hotel and The Blakeney Harbour Association. Residents Car Park Permits – 2021/22

Those of you eligible for the Carnser Residents Permits (a permanent resident on the electoral roll for Blakeney & only property owned) and the Coronation Car Park Residents Permits (a permanent resident on the electoral roll for Blakeney, only property owned, has to be a High Street address, which has no parking of its own), are advised that they are ready for distribution now. The current permits expire on 31^{st} March 2021, and it is your responsibility to ensure that you display a current permit at all times.

In order to determine genuine permanent residents, you must produce a copy of your most recent Council Tax Bill from North Norfolk District Council. The information provided on this, will determine whether or not you are eligible for a free permit.

Due to COVID, the Parish Office is currently closed to the public, however, you can still drop the required information through the letterbox or in an email, i.e., name, address and copy of Council Tax bill, and vehicle registration details. All Council Tax bills, will be shredded/deleted unless you ask for them to be returned. Please ensure that you leave your contact email, or phone number, just in case further information is required.

Extracts from the virtual meeting of **Blakeney Parish** Council which was held on **Tuesday 4th May 2021**.

Wells Safer Neighbourhood Police Team – PC Jason Pegden had forwarded the following report in his absence. Since the last meeting of the Parish Council, there have been 9 calls to the Police, 2 for breach of health orders & 7 other calls. There has also been 1 report of criminal damage.

County Councillor - Dr. Marie Strong was unable to join us, due to attending other Council meetings this evening. (Since this meeting, we have of course learnt that Marie, decided not to stand for the County Councillor position this time around. We have thanked her for all her hard work and support for our village during the past 12 years, and we wish her all the very best for the future.)

Planning - PF = Full Planning Permission, PM = Planning Permission - Reserved Matters, LA = Alteration to Listed Building.

We will bring to the attention of newly appointed District Councillor our increasing concerns over the implication of the untimely placement of the yellow **Site Planning Notices** by NNDC.

PF/21/0225 – *Proposal; Demolition of single storey detached dwelling and erection of two storey replacement dwelling at,* **Glebe Lodge, Saxlingham Road, Blakeney.** *No objection.*

NP/21/1025 – Proposal; Prior notification of proposed agricultural development – lean-to extension to existing grain store and monopitch machinery building at, **The Brecks, Bilsey Road, Langham.** No objection.

PF/21/0810 – Amended Proposal; Detached garage with room within roof space to front of dwelling; single storey rear extension to dwelling and external alterations including replacement windows and render and timber cladding finishes over external brickwork at, **Navestock, Cley Road, Blakeney.** No objection, subject to it not being used for residential purposes.

PF/21/1005 – Proposal; Single and part two storey rear extension to dwelling at, Saltmarsh, 18 Morston Road, Blakeney. No objection.

PF/21/0944 – Proposal; Demolition of redundant garages and erection of 4 dwellings (2 no. 1 bedroom flats and 2 no. 2 bedroom houses) with associated parking and landscaping at, **Land East of 21 Queens Close, Blakeney.** No objection, subject to the removal of the three balconies and also subject to there being no detrimental land contamination from prior use of the site.

PF/21/1028 – Proposal; Change of use of part of shop to form separate dwelling (to include part of existing dwelling); alterations to ground floor windows and door in front elevation at, **The Anchor Gift Shop**, **35 High Street**, **Blakeney.** No objection, as we would rather retain a smaller retail outlet than lose it altogether.

LA/21/1029 – Proposal; Internal and external works to facilitate change of use of part of shop to form separate dwelling (to include part of existing dwelling) including alterations to ground floor windows and door in front elevation, relocation of projecting sign at, The Anchor Gift Shop, 35 High Street, Blakeney. No objection, as we would rather retain a smaller retail outlet, than lose it altogether.

PF/21/0705 – *Re-consultation as the yellow planning site notice was not erected for the public, until one week after the consultation deadline. Proposal; Two storey rear extension at,* **26 Langham Road, Blakeney.** *No objection, subject to the removal of the Juliet balcony.*

PF/21/0226 & LA/21/0227 – Proposal; Replacement side extension following demolition of existing side extension at, **Red House, The Quay, Blakeney.** No objection.

FINANCE - Accounts totalling £15,174.46 are approved.

Darkside Running – On Saturday 12th June 2021, we welcome Darkside running to Blakeney, where their Sunset Ultra Marathon will commence from the quayside. During the afternoon, around 50 runners will begin their 35-mile journey westwards along the Coast Path, hoping to beat the sunset to the finish line on the beach at Snettisham. As government restrictions have eased Darkside have been working closely with England Athletics, Norfolk County Council, the Norfolk Safety Advisory Group and other local bodies to be able to put this event on in a COVID secure manner. With the majority of running events cancelled during 2020, competitors are excited to once again be able to undertake running adventures such as this and experience the beauty of the Norfolk coastline.

Reports from Representatives on Other Committees/Groups

Village Hall Rep - Electric Vehicle Charge Points – Blakeney Garage (EH). *Resolved* that BPC should only enter into such a scheme if a full grant is received. The Clerk will make enquires to NNDC and other Parish & Town Councils.

Finance & Governance Committee – (RT) – Met on 27^{th} April and worked through and adopted a whole suite of

procedural documents, as listed in the minutes of said meeting.

Party on The Pastures Committee' -

The Parish Council defers making a decision about allowing the committee to plan an event for the 22^{nd} August 2021 until the June PC meeting.

We will be relaunching the **Community Awards Scheme** this year, more to follow.

As per a request from the **Trustees of the Pastures**, asking for BPC to give a statement in advance of a planning application from The Blakeney Hotel for an overflow car park.

'Blakeney Parish Council, would in principle, look favourably on a planning application by The Blakeney Hotel to establish an overflow car park, restricted to staff and guest's cars within the Hotel's owned ground to the north of The Pastures, subject to; the removal of the wooden palisade around that area; suitable landscaping to minimise the visual impact of parked vehicles; joint commitment to the discontinuance of parking on the public roadway across The Pastures; agreement on positioning an appropriate entrance/exit.

CORRESPONDENCE

We would be delighted to act as a venue for the **Macmillan Mighty Hike 2022.** The 10th or 11th June 2022 would suit us as per the dates suggested by them and we are in further discussions.

Having reviewed the effectiveness of the Dog Waste Bins within the parish we have asked The Manor Hotel if they would consider relocating the bin at the Hotel to the Cart Track opposite which is National Trust land, and that going forward they then both share the cost of servicing the bin, which would serve the wider public as well as the hotel guests. This area of the village is one of the two most complained about parts of the village in terms of dog mess. We will also relocate our bin from the top of The Pastures to the other side of The Pastures, ie. near to the Little Lane entrance/exit. We have 11 dog bins in the village in total, with the Parish Council responsible for 9 of them, they are well dotted about, and yet still some dog owners are unable to locate a bin! However, that is no valid excuse and you are (believe it or not) allowed to take your waste home and put in your own bin!! Just a thought...

Blakeney Parish Council have advised that we are only happy to proceed with our housing enquiries regarding the Former School Field in association with **Broadland Housing Association & Blakeney Neighbourhood Housing Society** if there are no market houses in the mix and that we revert back to a small development of say 6 - 8 small houses, i.e., affordable local housing only.

Resumption of BPC Meetings – So, Government did not grant an extension to virtual meetings for Parish & Town Councils going forward. This means that we will be reverting back to our, in person face to face meetings and we look forward to seeing some of you, who have joined us in the past, but where 'zooming' has not been for you. (It was a learning curve for most of us.)

We have therefore booked the Scout Hut for our next Full Council meeting on Tuesday 1st June as it is more spacious than the Parish Office. However, the venue is only permitted to allow a certain number of people inside due to Covid restrictions we will have to manage accordingly, and so for the time being if you do wish to join us at a meeting, if you could please let the The Clerk know in advance that you plan to attend (a quick phone call or an email), that would be helpful and we will set the room out accordingly.

Election Congratulations!

We look forward to working with Victoria Holliday, who has been duly elected as our new **District Councillor**. We have already been in touch and forwarded some items, which we would like her to take forward on our behalf. We also have a new **County Councillor** who we await to hear from!

Whilst there have been no elections for **Blakeney Parish Council**, we have held our Annual General Meeting, which is where we appoint members to a whole range of committees, organisations and Charitable Trusts, shared here, so you can see just how much we have to manage and juggle.



Thoughts from the Rectory For June 2021

We had a surprise visit to the benefice a few weeks back. Jane Steen, the next Bishop of Lynn – whose role is as assistant to the Bishop of Norwich – was unveiled (metaphorically only!) on 28^{th} April, when her appointment to the post was announced in the media. She joined Bishop Graham and others on a day-long whistle-stop tour of the diocese, to introduce her to different aspects of life in Norfolk – a very different environment from Southwark in London, where she's currently serving as Archdeacon. One of the reasons the group came here to the Glaven Valley that day was to visit the scene of our monthly Breakfasts and Lunches that normally take place in Blakeney Church, run and enjoyed by people from around the Benefice. (And let's hope it won't be too much longer before we're able to restart those.)

There's widespread delight that we will now have a woman as one of the three bishops in our diocese. Of course, we're aware that there are still a few people for whom this is a difficult issue, but for most of us, there is real pleasure that the Church is becoming more and more diverse and balanced.

The number of womenclergy in the Church of England continues to grow. There is still work to be done in terms of ethnic diversity among the clergy, but we're heading in the right direction. On the ground, thank goodness, most people's experience of the local church is of a broad, welcoming community, where everyone is valued and encouraged and energised.

The Church may be God's idea, but it's still a human institution, and therefore imperfect! Work in progress, but definitely progressing!

My prayer is that everyone will know that they are welcome and cherished in our churches, irrespective of gender, ethnicity, sexuality, or indeed creed. We are here to share the message that God's love is there for everyone equally, and to serve everyone we meet without distinction.

Jane will be consecrated bishop in Norwich Cathedral on 23rd June. If you're able to, please do pray for her in the coming weeks. And if anyone would like to watch the service, it will also be streamed online on the diocesan website(www.dioceseofnorwich.org).

Services - opening up some more...

Good news! From now on (actually as of 17 May), we're no longer requiring people to prebook places for the weekly 9.30 service at Blakeney (which had been the case because of Covid). So, people can now just turn up for services at any of our churches without having to give prior notice, as in the old days! We will still record attenders' names, just to be safe, in case contact should be required later. And until the guidance changes, we will of course continue with the requirements for face-masks, distancing and sanitising. As ever, we'll monitor developments, and adjust as appropriate.

Cley Parish Council's Chairman's Report May 2021

May's meeting was the Annual Parish Meeting as well as the Annual Parish Council Meeting.

Here are the highlights of the Chairman's report from the Annual Parish Meeting which reflects all the work undertaken by the Parish Council since 2019.

The Parish Council's biggest achievement in the last two years was fundraising for and building the community toilet. This project was only the success it was because of the full support of the local community. The allotments have been transformed over the last couple of years, back in 2019 the Parish Council were struggling to let plots, whereas now we are letting new plots every month. The Parish Council have invested in the allotments by installing 3 additional water taps and have planted up the hedges to enhance and secure the site.

Cley Parish Council has also secured faster Broadband speeds for the village of Cley, with Government funding secured and work has already started to deliver fibre to the premises (FTTP). Completion is expected in the Autumn this year.

A volunteer group was set up in Covid to get shopping, prescriptions and support. The Parish Council secured a £1000 Covid Grant and provided hot meals or Covid Hardship gift vouchers to help those suffering as a consequence of the pandemic. The Parish Council partnered up with the Spar in Blakeney and offered food deliveries, which still continue three times a week. Cley Parish Council were nominated in the Stars of Norfolk and Waveney Awards 2020.

The Newgate Green Restoration was finalised and thank you to everyone for contributing towards the project.

Improvements have been made to the area of Parish Land at the bottom of Old Womans' Lane to allow school children to be picked up and dropped off safely by the bus. The Parish Council has been working closely with the Environment Agency who are currently delivering a new footpath link for the parish.

In 2019 yellow cones were placed in a number of identified and agreed locations in an attempt to prevent unsafe parking and improve traffic flow. The scheme was a huge success the first year but less so the second, so the Parish Council's has put out a Traffic Management Consultation to look into what else can be done.

Cley Parish Council have set up a Community Speed Watch team, and are on the rota for using a SAM2 (flashing speed sign) which is moved around the parish at 6-week intervals.

Cley Parish Council wrote its own Dark Skies Policy which uses guidance from CPRE to highlight the important measures needed to protect the special landscape in which Cley sits. The policy has since also been adopted by Blakeney. Now the Parish is working on other projects such as installing electric car charging points in the Village Hall Car Park, campaigning for a toilet at Cley Beach, protecting the flint walls in Cley using Article 4 Directions and campaigning for Holt Hill to be gritted during the winter months.'

We are very keen to have a portaloo on the beach over the busy summer period, but for the third year in a row, we are having trouble persuading Norfolk Wildlife Trust that this is a public health necessity. We would really appreciate your help here as we think a public demonstration of support will aid our cause. If you agree it's needed, please do get in touch. The Hangs inquiry is scheduled for 27th July and we are pushing for it to be held in Cley rather than Salthouse.

The Traffic Management Consultation is out and we are receiving lots of replies. Thank you. There is one error in that we show a potential location for double yellow lines outside Millers House on the High Street, which is not the case. Closing date is June 4th so please get your comments in. We'd like to hear from the whole village – after all, parking and speeding affect everyone in Cley - and we are completely open minded about the outcome.

We continue to debate the development of the Barn on the Marsh with planners, where seemingly a building in a flood risk zone (as well as an extremely sensitive landscape) can be developed with any planning controls or environmental assessment.

We've met with the Affordable Housing Team at NNDC regarding shared ownership sales of social housing managed by Flagship. There are fewer social houses coming up in the District for disposal from Flagship, as many houses which have been identified as in bad condition have already been disposed of. The shared ownership agreement which has been promised to Cley has less potential than we'd hoped, as many of the homes being disposed of are not in Cley and are unsuitable for a mortgage as they require work. Affordable housing was discussed in the parish and NNDC have agreed to look into this and report back their findings to CPC.
